There are three main domains of learning and all teachers should know about them and use them to construct lessons. These domains of learning are the cognitive (thinking), the affective (social/emotional/feeling), and the psychomotor (physical/kinesthetic) domain, and each one of these has a taxonomy associated with it. Taxonomy is simply a word for a classification.

This has paved the way to now measure the effectiveness of social learning initiatives and the results speak for themselves. Social learning approaches have a 75:1 ROI ratio compared to formal web-based training. Course completion increased to 85% on HBX, a Harvard Business School online education initiative when it introduced social learning.

Social strategies can help learners to achieve more effective language learning and obtain a better understanding of different cultures. People's feelings, attitudes, anxieties and motivation have an impact on the progress of language learning and performance. Indeed, using affective strategies can help us to control these feelings.

Learner Training 4 - Social and Affective Strategies

A learning team constantly engages in a cycle of learning: analyzing data, setting goals, and learning individually and collaboratively, as well as implementing and adjusting practices to meet the needs of all learners. This process allows teachers to try new teaching practices and discover what's working and what isn't.

The social constructivist approach which Barnes refers to emphasises the social nature of learning. This emphasis is also shared by current approaches to adult learning. For example, Lea (2002) refers to the 'social turn': the shift from an individual approach to a much more socially and culturally based approach.

Formal cooperative learning groups. In formal cooperative learning students work together for one or more class periods to complete a joint task or assignment (Johnson et al., 2014). There are several features that can help these groups work well: The instructor defines the learning objectives for the activity and assigns students to groups.

Effective teaching practices include fostering group ownership, providing intense shared experiential activities, capitalizing on the interrelationship of critical reflection and affective learning, developing an awareness of personal and social contextual influences, and promoting value-laden content.

The learning sciences of today recognize the tri-dimensional nature of learning as involving cognitive, social and emotional phenomena. However, many computer-supported argumentation systems still fail in addressing the socio-emotional aspects of group reasoning, perhaps due to a lack of an integrated theoretical vision of how these three dimensions interrelate to each other.
