Exposition of James, Epistles of John, Peter, and Jude ...

The "general" epistles, also known as the "Catholic" epistles (meaning universal, not to a specific church or individual) are the books of 1 and 2 Peter, James, Jude, 1, 2 and 3 John. Sometimes these books can be confusing, particularly James with its message of works which seems to contradict Paul's message of salvation by faith.

The Message of the General Epistles in the History of ...

That group comprised Simon Peter, Andrew, James, John, Phillip, Bartholomew, Matthew, Thomas, James son of Alphaeus, Simon the Zealot, Judas son of James, and Judas Iscariot. Of those twelve, three disciples (Peter, James, and John) seem to have been the closest to Jesus and acted as an "inner circle" to Christ.

Why did Jesus choose Peter, James, and John to be His ...

It is most characteristic of 1 John, 2 Peter, and Jude among these Epistles. The idea is that of being preserved by the Divine power until the coming of Christ - a preservation of which there was the more need to be assured in face of the falling away which threatened the Churches, and had indeed begun in some.
