The first step in right-sizing PACU Phase I LOS was to assess the effectiveness of the PACU discharge criteria. As the Aldrete scoring system is used as the primary criterion for determining discharge readiness, the specific aim was to determine the effectiveness of the Aldrete scoring tool for this facility.

Aldrete Discharge Scoring: Appropriate for Post Anesthesia ...

Use of an appropriate PACU scoring system is encouraged for each patient on admission, at appropriate intervals prior to discharge and at the time of discharge. 3. General medical supervision and coordination of patient care in the PACU should be the responsibility of an anesthesiologist. 4.

Discharge From the PACU Standard Aldrete Score: Simple sum of numerical values assigned to activity, respiration, circulation, consciousness, and oxygen saturation. A score of 9 out of 10 shows readiness for discharge. Post-anesthesia Discharge Scoring System: Modification of the Aldrete score which also includes an assessment of pain, N/V, and ...

Both scores can be helpful as guidelines in determining when a patient is ready for discharge. Inclusion of oxygen saturation by pulse oximetry is indicated. Before a child can be safely discharged from the PACU, a careful examination should be conducted to ensure safety on the patient floor, with its reduced nursing care and observation (Box ...

Assess puncture site 30 minutely for 4 hours than hourly until ambulation. Reassess site after first ambulation and then a minimum of 4 hourly prior to discharge. Note: the puncture site assessment commences from the time the patient enters the PACU, not when they are transferred to the inpatient unit. Patient is required to remain on bed rest for:

The patient is discharged from the PACU when he or she meets established criteria for discharge, as

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determined by a scale. One example is the Aldrete scale, which scores the patient's mobility, respiratory status, circulation, consciousness, and pulse oximetry.
